
Design a logo or poster for your business using drawings, slogans, and creative layouts. Use correct punctuation and capital letters throughout your work!





$$Revenue = Selling \ Price \ per \ Item \times Items \ Sold$$

$$Profit = Revenue - Total Expenses$$

3. Find the Break-Even Point:

$$Break-even\ Point = \frac{Total\ Expenses}{Selling\ Price\ per\ Item}$$

- 4. Graph It Out: Make a pie chart or bar graph to show your expense distribution.
- **5. Math Journal (Reflection):** Briefly discuss how this activity helped you build the connection between mathematics skills and entrepreneurship.
